Gujarat is one of the most prosperous states of India, thanks to the impressive agricultural productivity and industrial development. The per capita GDP of Gujarat is 2.5 times the country's average GDP. The state leads the country in various industrial sectors namely textiles, engineering, chemicals, petrochemicals, drugs and pharmaceuticals, dairy, cement and ceramics, gems and jewellery. The state contributes to 21 per cent of the country's exports and 6.42 per cent of the national GDP at constant prices. Gujarat's GDP is now growing at a rate of around 12 per cent each year. The per capita GDP of Gujarat is more than twice the all-India average. With a population of around 5.5 crore, the per capita income of Gujarat is over the INR 18,500 mark. Recently, many developers have initiated townships in and around the major urban centers in Gujarat, under the policy framed by the Government of Gujarat which provides huge affordable housing stock in the major cities.
